The BiG Challenge

The BiG Challenge aims to ignite entrepreneurial spirit through a city-wide competition that connects young people (years 7-9) and employers through an immersive enterprise experience. Students are loaned £25 start-up funding and supported to develop an idea to test in the market over the festive season, reflecting on their experience as the programme completes in February. The challenge ends with a 'Dragon's Den' style presentation and celebration and awards event.

Purpose of the role and expectations

BiG Challenge Advisory Group members support the development of the competition and provide an insight from a business point of view.

This is an ongoing strategic role, working with other businesses on the Advisory Group and making recommendations on the future direction and development of the competition.

This is an unpaid volunteer role from October until March to begin with - there may be an opportunity to be part of the group longer term if desired.

Advisory Group Members will:

- Attend four meetings over the course of the project for around one hour at a time
- Help to inform and steer the competition, providing an insight from a business point of view
- Support the promotion of the BiG Challenge as a flagship educator and employer collaboration initiative for the city
- Declare any potential conflicts of interest and agree not to use their position to promote or sell services of any sort to schools or colleges

- Professionals with strategic experience or experience of running / owning a business
- Passionate about motivating young people and helping to improve their life chances by promoting entrepreneurship and enterprise
- Able to work effectively with others and contribute to discussions
- Have a sound knowledge and understanding of the business landscape

We are looking to build an Advisory Group that reflects the diversity of Sheffield in terms of disabilities, gender, ethnicity and socio-economic background, and actively encourage participation from volunteers who are able to contribute to this.
